Isaac to Mount Moriah, ready to offer him as a sacrifice because God had spoken. Rahab obeyed the instructions of the spies and bound a scarlet cord in the window of her home, saving her family. Moses stretched his rod over the Red Sea, causing the sea to recede and become dry land, just as God had said. Gideon obeyed the angel of the Lord and saved Israel from the Midianites. Salvation, deliverance, and freedom came to each of these because they obeyed God.²



FEAR

One of the biggest hurdles we face after we understand God's directive is fear. Fear drives us until we are emotionally overwhelmed and frozen in inactivity. We tremble like a military commander, facing the enemy without necessary support. Yet, all the time, THE LORD IS OUR HELPER! If we trust Him, He will orchestrate His will in our lives. He is more than enough!

I understand this fear because many years ago I was prompted by people I trusted and by my own heart to do radio broadcasts. I knew I couldn't do it! I didn't have the skill, the finances, or the necessary equipment, so I absolutely refused! Yet, over time, the Lord continued to deal with me until I consented. What a growing experience! But truly, the Lord was with us, and He met every need. He is so faithful!

As we read the Scripture, we note that no God -assigned task is without obstacles! Paul constantly faced persecution as he declared the mystery of the gospel. Noah's message of righteousness was refused as he prepared for the flood. Moses was continually challenged by Israel's disobedience. Daniel was thrown into the lion's den because he prayed. Peter was arrested and imprisoned in order to please the Jews. David fled from King Saul who sought to kill him.³

But, here is the good news. The angel of the Lord released Peter from prison. The lions did not devour Daniel. Noah and his family were saved from the flood. Israel was granted mercy because Moses stood before God on her behalf. And, of course, Paul impacted our lives by yielding to the Holy Spirit and writing most of the New Testament record.

Years ago, the Lord directed me to teach His Word. Although I have not been challenged by lions or imprisoned, I have been overcome by fear and reluctance. Yet, early one morning, just before sunrise, I heard words that continue to encourage me. I cling to God's message and am comforted when I remember that "God is <u>with</u> us! God is <u>for</u> us! God is <u>in</u> us! God comes <u>upon</u> us! God works <u>through</u> us!" We have only to trust and obey!
