

Gods Healing Word Becky Combee

I have been teaching the principles of divine healing for many years, and there is one thing I know for certain. God wants us to be healed! Yet healing cannot be obtained by personal sacrifice or strenuous effort. Physical and mental health cannot be appropriated because of superior intellect or amazing talent. Jesus alone paid the price for our healing. He was the sacrifice for sin, and it is by His stripes we are healed.

I was reminded of this great truth and the futility of our own effort when I was praying for a gentleman who was ill. As I was interceding, I saw him standing with his shirt off and stripes being laid across his back. My heart began to cry out, "No, no, no. Jesus took the stripes for you. You don't have to take them. The price has been paid for your healing." This image of his attempt to personally sacrifice himself was clearly displayed on my heart, and the meaning cannot be misunderstood. We cannot pay the price for our healing.

We attempt to pay the price for our healing when we question God's sacrifice with our words. When our words reflect how we feel or what we see, we relinquish the anchor of God's Word. We are blown about by our senses and the truth of God's sacrifice is negated in our lives. Our confession of doubt and unbelief roadblocks faith and prevents our healing.

Yet almost everyone is challenged by doubt when they face a health crisis and debilitating pain. But these factors DO NOT silence the power of God's promise. God has spoken and His Word is true. The Psalmist says, "He sent his word, and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions." This tremendous promise is effective in our lives when we believe it and confess it.

Faith is inoperative without confession. We cannot believe in God's healing word and continually voice our dilemma. We must speak God's Words of truth. The apostle Paul writes, "We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is

We must also eliminate words of doubt from our vocabulary. We cannot receive from God when speaking words contrary to the Scripture. When God says that I am healed, our saying, "I feel terrible. I'm getting worse and worse," will not activate His healing power.

I have decided to boldly confess God's words of truth. I believe in Jesus' sacrifice for sin and disease. I know His stripes were the payment for physical dilemmas. My words will echo this truth. Jesus is my healer. I will SAY SO!
